

EXPORT CONTROL COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

1. Purpose

This statement confirms Inspectahire Instrument Company Limited's commitment to complying with applicable United Kingdom export control and trade sanctions requirements relevant to the supply, hire, service, export or transfer of goods, software and technology.

This statement supports compliance with the Export Control Act 2002, the Export Control Order 2008, applicable UK Strategic Export Control Lists and relevant UK trade sanctions legislation.

2. Scope

This statement applies to Inspectahire's business activities involving the supply, hire, service, export or transfer of goods, software or technology that may be subject to United Kingdom export controls or trade sanctions. This includes equipment that may have both civil and military applications where relevant.

This includes the physical export, temporary export, electronic transfer and communication of controlled goods, software, technology and technical data where applicable.

3. Commitment to Compliance

Inspectahire is committed to complying with applicable United Kingdom export control and trade sanctions legislation. Controlled goods, software or technology will not be exported or transferred without appropriate checks being undertaken and, where required, the necessary licence or authorisation being obtained.

Where there is uncertainty regarding classification, end-use, end-user, destination or licensing requirements, appropriate guidance will be sought before the transaction proceeds.

Inspectahire will not knowingly engage in transactions that breach applicable export control legislation, sanctions requirements or licence conditions.

4. Responsibility and Competency

Personnel involved in sales, operations, logistics and other export-related activities are responsible for ensuring that applicable export control requirements are considered before goods, software or technology are supplied or transferred. Senior Management retains overall responsibility for ensuring appropriate compliance arrangements are maintained.

The Quality Assurance Manager supports the maintenance, review and assurance of the documented compliance arrangements. Relevant personnel will receive appropriate information, instruction or training according to their responsibilities.

5. Proportionate Controls and Risk Awareness

Inspectahire applies a proportionate, risk-based approach to export control compliance that is suitable for the scale and nature of our operations.

Where relevant, Inspectahire will:

- Determine whether goods, software or technology are subject to applicable export controls, including items with military, security, surveillance, strategic or dual-use applications.
- Consider the destination, customer, end-user and intended end-use, including screening against applicable sanctions and restricted party lists where appropriate, at the point of sale or hire.
- Seek guidance or export licences where necessary, particularly for overseas transactions involving controlled goods. Also considering applicable trade sanctions, restrictions and potential diversion risks.
- Seek guidance, classification assistance or export licences where required, taking account of applicable sanctions, embargoes, restrictions and diversion risks.
- Retain appropriate records of checks, licenses, authorisations and supporting documentation to demonstrate compliance if required by auditors or regulators.
- Escalate unusual or suspicious enquiries to Senior Management before proceeding.
- Refuse or suspend transactions where export control, sanctions or end-use concerns cannot be satisfactorily resolved
- Where an export licence is required, the customer or other party responsible for exporting the equipment must obtain the appropriate authorisation before shipment. Inspectahire will not apply for, obtain, or manage export licences for hired equipment.

6. Communication and Improvement

The Export Control Compliance Statement and supporting arrangements will be reviewed within 13 months, or sooner where significant legislative, regulatory or operational changes occur.

Relevant requirements will be communicated to personnel involved in export-related activities, and the arrangements will be reviewed where changes, concerns or opportunities for improvement are identified.

Inspectahire ensures full cooperation with relevant regulatory bodies, including the ECJU, MOD and external auditors, as part of our commitment to transparent and accountable operations.
